

Campaigns Champion

Role description

The MND Campaigns Champions are the voices of the MND community, including people living with MND, their family, friends and carers, when meeting members of parliament, electoral candidates, community leaders, service providers, health bodies, Government bodies and the media. They work to raise awareness of MND and to create positive change in their communities and nationally.

What is involved?

As a Campaigns Champion you will:

- Help create and drive local momentum for all our national and local campaigns
- Encourage others in your network to take action
- Inform those in your network of the latest campaigning news and activities
- Talk to politicians and decision makers about what MND is and why it is important that people with the disease have access to high quality care and support services and assistive technology
- Work with your local MND Association staff to identify issues and gather evidence for potential campaigns
- Be part of the online MND Action Network and encourage others to join
- Look for ways to incorporate campaigns activities into existing events planned at your State Association.

This role will suit me if I:

- Have an interest in learning and improving my campaigning skills
- Have the desire to make a positive difference for people with MND, their carers and families
- Have good communication and networking skills
- Am able to work on my own initiative
- Am computer literate and have access to email/the internet

- Get access to a range of training workshops and events
- Get support from MND Australia and MND Victoria staff

How flexible is the role?

The Campaigns Champion will need to work from home for approximately 2- 4 hours a week. Tasks will be tailored depending on individual skills, experience and the availability of the volunteer.

You'll be inducted into the role. As part of it, you will receive e-learning and face-to-face training.
